MINUTES [Draft]

Board Members Present: President Lori E. Lightfoot, Vice President Ghian Foreman, Michael Eaddy, Steve Flores, Rita A. Fry, John P. O'Malley Jr., and Rhoda D. Sweeney (via audio conference).

Board Members Absent: Eva-Dina Delgado, John H. Simpson.

Others Present: Superintendent of Police Eddie T. Johnson, Deputy Director of CPD Legal Affairs Tina M. Skahill, Independent Police Review Authority Chief Administrator Sharon Fairley, Police Board Executive Director Max A. Caproni, and members of the public.

President Lightfoot called the meeting to order. She reported that Ms. Sweeney is not able to attend the meeting in person and wishes to attend via audio conference. Ms. Fry moved to permit attendance via audio conference. The motion passed by a vote of 6 in favor (Lightfoot, Foreman, Eaddy, Flores, Fry, and O'Malley) to 0 opposed.

- 1. Ms. Fry moved to approve the minutes of the Board's regular public meeting held on July 20, 2017. The motion passed by a vote of 7 in favor (Lightfoot, Foreman, Eaddy, Flores, Fry, O'Malley, and Sweeney) to 0 opposed.
- 2. President Lightfoot announced that the Board's next regular public meeting will be at 7:30 p.m. on Monday, September 18, 2017, at Chicago Public Safety Headquarters.

Ms. Fry moved to close a series of executive sessions of the Board for the purposes of considering litigation and personnel matters, as authorized by sections 2(c)(1), (3), (4), and (11) of the Illinois Open Meetings Act. The motion passed by a vote of 7 in favor (Lightfoot, Foreman, Eaddy, Flores, Fry, O'Malley, and Sweeney) to 0 opposed.

3. President Lightfoot stated that a report of disciplinary actions taken by the Board during the previous month appears in the blue books made available at the meeting, and she noted that this

report and the Board's written findings and decisions are posted on the Board's website. She then announced that the Board considered in a closed meeting one disciplinary case, and that the Board will now take final action on this case.

• Case No. 16 PB 2919. Mr. O'Malley moved to find Police Officer Michael Mette not guilty of use of excessive force and making a false statement. The motion passed by a vote of 4 in favor (Eaddy, Fry, O'Malley, and Sweeney) to 2 opposed (Lightfoot and Flores). Ms. Fry moved to adopt the written findings and decision and dissent that have been reviewed by all Board members who participated in the case. The motion passed by a vote of 6 in favor (Lightfoot, Eaddy, Flores, Fry, O'Malley, and Sweeney) to 0 opposed.

President Lightfoot stated that the decision in the above case will be entered as of today's date and will be issued to the parties, and that a copy of the written decision will be posted on the Board's website within ten business days pursuant to the Municipal Code of Chicago.

4. President Lightfoot noted that one of the Board's hearing officers, Jacqueline Walker, has decided to retire after nearly 30 years of service. President Lightfoot thanked Ms. Walker for her years of service, and stated that in June the Board began a search for a new hearing officer. President Lightfoot reported that the Board received 29 applications and conducted two rounds of interviews of the top candidates.

Ms. Fry moved to designate Allison Wood as a hearing officer of the Police Board pursuant to Section 2-84-030 of the Municipal Code of Chicago. The motion passed by a vote of 7 in favor (Lightfoot, Foreman, Eaddy, Flores, Fry, O'Malley, and Sweeney) to 0 opposed.

- 5. President Lightfoot announced that copies of the general orders and other directives issued by the Superintendent of Police during the previous month are listed in the blue books made available at the meeting and are accessible on the Police Department's website.
- 6. President Lightfoot noted that the next item of business is the Superintendent's report. Superintendent Johnson encouraged members of the public to attend one of the town-hall meetings that are coming up regarding the draft policy for the new community policing policy for the Police Department. (See the transcript of the meeting, posted on the Board's website, for a complete report of Superintendent Johnson's remarks.)

7. President Lightfoot called upon those members of the public who had signed up in advance to speak. (See the transcript of the meeting, posted on the Board's website, for a complete report of each speaker's remarks.)

- President Lightfoot called upon the following individuals and there was no response: Samyra McDonald and Stacey Liberty.
- Gwendolyn Moore spoke about the shooting of her son, Jamaal Moore, by a police officer on July 15, 2012.
- Dorothy Holmes spoke about the shooting of her son, Ronald Johnson, by a police officer on October 12, 2014.
- Panzy Edwards spoke about the shooting of her son, Dakota Bright, by a police officer on November 8, 2012. Chief Administrator Fairley reported that the Independent Police Review Authority issued tonight a report on its investigation of this shooting.
- Crista Noel spoke about a several matters.
- President Lightfoot called upon William Calloway, who stated that he did not wish to make any comments.

President Lightfoot stated that all persons that had signed up in advance to speak had been called. She then thanked Ms. Fry for her seven years of service on the Police Board. Vice President Foreman moved to adjourn the meeting. The motion passed by a vote of 7 in favor (Lightfoot, Foreman, Eaddy, Flores, Fry, O'Malley, and Sweeney) to 0 opposed.

Ms. Fry moved to find Police Officer Eugene Posey guilty of detaining and transporting an individual without justification, and to discharge him from the Chicago Police Department. The motion passed by a vote of 9 in favor (Lightfoot, Foreman, Delgado, Eaddy, Flores, Fry, O'Malley, Simpson, and Sweeney) to 0 opposed. Vice President Foreman moved to adopt the written findings and decision that have been reviewed by all Board members who participated in the case. The motion passed by a vote of 9 in favor (Lightfoot, Foreman, Delgado, Eaddy, Flores, Fry, O'Malley, Simpson, and Sweeney) to 0 opposed.

President Lightfoot stated that the decision in the above case will be entered as of today's date and will be issued to the parties, and that a copy of the written decision will be posted on the Board's website as required by the Municipal Code of Chicago.

Policy Regarding the Attendance of and Participation by the Public at Board Meetings

(Adopted 15 December 2005)

The Police Board values the attendance of the public at its meetings and the opportunity to receive comments and questions on matters concerning the Board or the Police Department. The Board will treat members of the public with courtesy and respect, and expects that the public will treat Board members and Department members in a similar manner.

Toward that end, the Board has adopted the following rules governing conduct at Board meetings:

- 1. An individual wishing to address the Board must sign-up in advance by contacting the Board's office by phone, fax, or in person no later than 4:30 p.m. of the day before the meeting.
- 2. When called upon to address the Board, each speaker is to identify him/herself and speak clearly so that all in attendance may hear and so that the court reporter may make an accurate record of the proceedings.
- 3. Due to time constraints, each speaker is limited to two minutes and must conclude when asked to do so by the Board member acting as parliamentarian.
- 4. Personal attacks, obscene language, fighting words, threats, conduct intended to disrupt or interfere with the meeting, and comments not related to matters within the Board's or the Department's jurisdiction, by a speaker or any person in attendance, are strictly prohibited.

Violation of any of the above rules may result in the removal of the violator from the meeting room, or in the immediate adjournment of the meeting; in addition, repeated violations may result in the violator not being permitted to attend or participate in future Board meetings.

PERSONNEL AND TRAINING

During the month of **August 2017**, **176** training blocks were conducted for Chicago Police Recruits, Metropolitan Recruits (including surrounding agencies) and In-Service Courses.

A total of **41,120** Department attendees received In-Service/E-Learning training, which included: Body Worn Camera, Force Mitigation/Crisis Recognition & Response, LEMART, Prescribed Weapons Qualifications, Procedural Justice and Legitimacy 1 and 2, Power Test Administered, Patrol Carbine Requalification A, TASER Qualification and Re-Certification, COPA Taser, Firearms Concealed Carry Act Online Course, Body Warn Cameras: Law and Policies, Commission on Accreditation for Law Enforcement Agencies (CALEA) Familiarization, Directives: August 2017, Domestic Violence 4-Part Refresher, Use of Force 4 Hour Post-Classroom Requirements and In Car Camera Systems 2015.

A total of **606 Chicago Police Recruits** were in training along with **15 Metropolitan Police Recruits**.




