1	PRESIDENT LIGHTFOOT: Good evening. I am
2	Lori Lighfoot. I am calling the meeting to
3	order. Board members Foreman and Eaddy and
4	Sweeney are unable to attend in person wishing
5	to attend via audio conference. Is there a
6	motion to permit them to do so?
7	MR. SIMPSON: So move.
8	PRESIDENT LIGHTFOOT: Second?
9	MS. FRY: Second.
10	PRESIDENT LIGHTFOOT: All in favor?
11	(Unanimous ayes.)
12	PRESIDENT LIGHTFOOT: Any opposed? Motion
13	passes.
14	The first item of business is approval of
15	the Board's regular public meeting held on
16	April 20th, 2017. Is there a motion to approve
17	the minutes?
18	MS. FRY: So moved.
19	MR. SIMPSON: Second.
20	PRESIDENT LIGHTFOOT: All in favor?
21	(Unanimous ayes.)
22	PRESIDENT LIGHTFOOT: Any opposed? Motion
23	passes. Our next regular public meeting will
24	be on Thursday, June 15th at 7:30 p.m. here at
	McCorkle Litigation Services, Inc. Chicago, Illinois (312) 263-0052

Chicago Public Safety Headquarters. 1 Also. please note the regular meeting for September 2 3 has been rescheduled for Monday, September 18th 4 at 7:30 p.m. We'll of course remind you of the 5 change in schedule as we get closer to the day. 6 At this time I ask for a motion to close a 7 series of executive sessions for the purposes 8 of considering personnel matters in litigation as authorized by Sections 2(c)(1), (3), (4), and 9 (11) of the Illinois Open Meetings Act. 10 IS 11 there such a motion? 12 So moved. MS. FRY: 13 MR. SIMPSON: Second. 14 PRESIDENT LIGHTFOOT: All those in favor? (Unanimous ayes.) 15 16 PRESIDENT LIGHTFOOT: Any opposed? The 17 motion passes. A report of disciplinary actions taken by 18 19 the Board during the previous month has been 20 made available at this evening's meeting. 21 Also, copies of the Board's annual report have 22 been made available. These reports and the Board's written Findings and Decisions are 23 24 posted on the Board's website.

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1	The Police Board, as authorized by the
2	Open Meetings Act, has considered in a closed
3	meeting several disciplinary cases. The board
4	will now take final action on these cases.
5	Regarding Case No. 16 PB 2915, is there a
6	motion to find Police Officer Michael Monti
7	guilty of possession of marijuana and making
8	false statements, and to discharge him from the
9	Chicago Police Department?
10	MR. SIMPSON: So moved.
11	PRESIDENT LIGHTFOOT: Second?
12	MS. FRY: Second.
13	PRESIDENT LIGHTFOOT: All in favor?
14	Lightfoot, Foreman, Delgado, Eaddy,
15	Flores, Fry, Simpson and Sweeney voted in favor
16	of the motion by raising a hand.
17	Any opposed?
18	Voting in favor are Board Members Foreman,
19	Delgado, Eaddy, Flores, Fry, Simpson, Sweeney,
20	and myself. Board Member O'Malley is opposed.
21	The motion passes.
22	Is there a motion to adopt the written
23	Findings and Decisions and Dissent that has
24	been reviewed by all the Board members who

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1	participated in the case?
2	MS. FRY: So moved.
3	MR. SIMPSON: Second.
4	PRESIDENT LIGHTFOOT: All in favor?
5	(Unanimous ayes.)
6	PRESIDENT LIGHTFOOT: Any opposed? The
7	motion passes.
8	Regarding case No. 16 PB 2904, at last
9	month's meeting the Board granted the
10	Superintendent's motion to withdraw the charges
11	filed against Sergeant James Padar. Is there a
12	motion adopt the written order that has been
13	reviewed by all Board members who participated
14	in the case?
15	MS. FRY: So moved.
16	MR. SIMPSON: Second.
17	PRESIDENT LIGHTFOOT: All in favor? Any
18	opposed? The motion passes.
19	Regarding case No. 16 PB 2927, the
20	Superintendent filed charges to discharge
21	Police Officer Michael Sanchez from the Chicago
22	Police Department for engaging in a domestic
23	altercation and harassment. The Superintendent
24	moved to withdraw the charges without prejudice

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because the respondent resigned from the 1 2 Chicago Police Department. Is there a motion to grant the 3 Superintendent's motion to withdraw the charges 4 5 without prejudice? 6 MS. FRY: So moved. 7 Second. MR. SIMPSON: 8 PRESIDENT LIGHTFOOT: All in favor? Any opposed? Voting in favor are board members 9 Foreman, Delgado, Eaddy, Flores, Fry, O'Malley, 10 11 Simpson, Sweeney and myself. The motion passes 12 by a unanimous vote. 13 The Board's decisions in the cases of 14 which we have taken final action this evening 15 will be entered as of today's date and will be 16 issued to the parties. A copy of the written 17 decisions will be posted on the Board's website 18 within ten business days as required by the Chicago Municipal Code. 19 20 There is one additional disciplinary 21 matter to announce pursuant to Section 2-78-130 22 of the Municipal Code of Chicago, one member of 23 the Police Board has considered a matter on 24 which the Chief Administrator of the

Independent Police Review Authority and Superintendent of Police did not agree regarding the discipline of two officers. Case No. 17 RR 01 and 02 involved allegations that Police Officers Chris Hackett and John Valtierra violated an individual's Fourth Amendment right by entering a residence without a warrant, permission, or exigent circumstances. The Chief Administrator recommended sustaining the allegations and suspending both officers for 20 days. The Superintendent recommended that the allegation against each officer be classified as Exonerated.

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In the opinion of the Reviewing Member, Board Member Eaddy, the response of the Superintendent does not meet the burden of overcoming the Chief Administrator's recommendations for discipline.

A copy of the written opinion will be 21 posted on the Board's website as required by the Municipal Code of Chicago.

5	Is there a motion to waive the oral

8	MS. FRY: So moved.
9	MR. SIMPSON: Second.
10	PRESIDENT LIGHTFOOT: All in favor? Any
11	opposed? The motion passes.
12	I will call upon members of the public who
13	signed up in advance to speak. When your name
14	is called, please step up to the microphone.
15	First speaker is Lavonta Burks.
16	MR. BURKS: I need about two hours for all
17	of this. I want to say that I came today to
18	say that the police department been lying on me
19	since I was 12 years old. They set me up to
20	fail. They ran me over with police cars when I
21	was 14 years old. I got two GEDs from 51st
22	Street police station changing my name to make
23	sure I stay in the penitentiary. I caught a
24	case when I was 12. The case happened when I

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They waited until I was 13 to charge 1 was 12. 2 me as an adult, because my family did not know 3 about the laws. I can prove with my paperwork 4 that this department, some people, somebody in this department don't like me and you have been 5 setting me up since I was a kid, since I was a 6 7 I reported I was a runaway at the runaway. 8 hospital when I was a kid. No one helped, but 9 you come out and arrest me for things I didn't 10 do that someone else did. And I am just saving 11 I need some help. You have helped destroy my life with a lot of the things you done to me. 12 13 I missed my mother funeral because I was in jail because of this -- these names that they 14 15 I can prove it. I been trying to go gave me. I been trying to go to the world. 16 to the news. I want to go to the United Nations, because I 17 been speaking up about this since I been home 18 for a while now. I seeming not to get no help. 19 20 I spent from 12 to 25 in jail, but I been out 21 16 years. I was an honor roll student. I won 22 a drawing contest every year in grammar school. 23 Somebody don't like me. I would like to 24 know -- I am from Rockwell Gardens with the

Black Panthers before I was born. When I was a 1 2 kid I be walking down a street and a white cop come, put his hands in my pants and squeeze my 3 private parts and say, I hope you never 4 (inaudible) black motherfucker. So I been 5 through Hell, excuse my language, from this 6 7 department. I haven't been through none in a 8 while, they pulled me over for a DUI when I was 9 a limo driver, they found 20,000 in the limo, 10 locked me up for DUI. I go to court for 16 11 months. They dropped me for the speeding 12 ticket and DUI everything, what am I to do? If they want to kill me, just kill me then, get it 13 14 over with. I got nothing to live for. You 15 took my life, all my young hood, everything. 16 PRESIDENT LIGHTFOOT: Mr. Burke, I am 17 sorry to interrupt you, but if you'd like to 18 file a complaint, we'd be happy to hear your story. So we'd be happy to talk you --19 20 MR. BURKS: Who do I file a complaint 21 with? I went to the Clerk's office. I called 22 I've been with Lisa Madigan office. senators. 23 MS. FAIRLEY: You can file a complaint 24 with the Independent Police Review Authority.

1	There's several ways to do it, on line, you can
2	call us, you can see me afterwards, we'll
3	review the information to file a complaint.
4	MR. BURKS: Thank you, ma'am.
5	PRESIDENT LIGHTFOOT: Thank you, sir.
6	Next speaker is Crista Noel?
7	All right. We'll move on.
8	Queen sister?
9	QUEEN SISTER: I don't even have the
10	energy to give you a hard time this evening. I
11	want you to know the documents that we spoke of
12	regarding the initiative you have not received
13	yet, because I knew you were going to take them
14	to Washington to stand on. It will be in your
15	e-mail as of tomorrow. We are approaching
16	another season and accumulations of the dead
17	black body's but they're closer than ever to my
18	residence. Reggie was killed in a drive by on
19	the next block in back of my house on 160th and
20	Parnell. There was a shooting and it was roped
21	off at 107th and Normal and Parnell two weeks
22	ago. We got just the other day, Mother's Day,
23	in broad daylight mind you but just the other

24 day Friday we lost Tatiana Lewis and China

Stapleton, both of them which I am very familiar with because my circle is tight. I know my community, because I am in these streets, Lord. I want to know what it is you are going to tell her father because he's one of your very own, and I haven't been to see him, because I am at a loss for words and don't know what it is to say to him.

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Again, the public participation portion is not showing up in the transcripts. That promotes deceptive practice and needs to be looked into. I think that they should be available in the Blue Book for everyone to see.

PRESIDENT LIGHTFOOT: Are you talking about the transcripts?

QUEEN SISTER: Yes. Because you memorize them and summarize them. Then when you go to the website to the transcripts, they're omitted, which appears deceptive because we speak for the individuals that can't make it in the room.

MR. SIMPSON: I believe they're on thewebsite and complete.

QUEEN SISTER: I got screen shots to prove

1 to you they are not. So what is your name, 2 Mr. Simpson? 3 John. MR. SIMPSON: 4 QUEEN SISTER: Let's proceed accordingly. 5 we will get that fixed if MR. SIMPSON: 6 they're not there. 7 That's what should have QUEEN SISTER: 8 been done the last time I was here. 9 Now, December, the Caucasian guy stood here and asked you clearly that the Chicago 10 11 police have been guarding the Archdiocese for 12 seven years --13 PRESIDENT LIGHTFOOT: Your time is up. 14 QUEEN SISTER: He said who is footing the 15 bill. That is not in the transcripts, nor is 16 there a response. I am saying people got a 17 right to inquire. We have a right to know. 18 PRESIDENT LIGHTFOOT: Again, that 19 surprises me. You can see to your right there 20 is a court reporter who sits here every week --21 every month meeting, takes down verbatim 22 everything that is said. I believe that a 23 verbatim transcript, a complete transcript is 24 put up on our website but we'll look into it.

1	Everything that is said is recorded and
2	available for all to read.
3	QUEEN SISTER: For a copy of the
4	transcripts, who do I see? You don't respond
5	to your
6	PRESIDENT LIGHTFOOT: You should contact
7	Mr. Caproni at the office.
8	QUEEN SISTER: Is he here?
9	PRESIDENT LIGHTFOOT: He is not here, but
10	you know very well
11	QUEEN SISTER: We have done that. This is
12	all I am saying. We can't get ahead in the
13	rear-view mirror.
14	PRESIDENT LIGHTFOOT: Our next speaker is
15	EvAngel YHWHnewBN.
16	MS. YHWHNEWBN: Good evening all.
17	Superintendent, I am glad that you are back. I
18	don't know if I got to say happy new year to
19	you since you been back, but I am glad you are
20	here.
21	I have a message for macho, bottle
22	throwing, fist slinging soldier who said he was
23	sorry for the three counts of assault. If you
24	are sorry, plead guilty. My question is this,

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I wanted to know if all human beings are entitled to the sanctity of human life. Every time there is a homicide victim, we hear the narrative, he was a documented gang member. I have never heard the narrative he is a undocumented alien. I have never heard the he is a convicted child molester. So when it comes to the so-called documented gang member, he is obviously not entitled to the sanctity of life.

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Now, Jeffrey Dahlmer killed people, 11 12 masturbated with their organs and ate them but 13 he was always Mr. Dahlmer. More speaking (inaudible) 6 7 administrative assistant. This is -- can you 8 identify what this is, Superintendent Johnson? 9 This is a picture of a fireball on one of the 10 towers on September 11th. And I just --11 anything to spare people grief and shield them 12 from harm. I can't afford James 213 for those 13 of you who have shown mercy shall have no fear 14 of judgment. I can't afford not to do that 15 because it's a terrible thing to fall into the 16 hands of a living God. What happens is the able-bodied people who don't respond to this 17 18 type of thing and do what is necessary to 19 prevent it. I am really afraid that is where I 20 am going to end up.
