At West Pullman Park, just east of the field house, a rare and impressive grove of over 60 oaks and hickories presides over the hilltop.

The slight rise in elevation of the landscape is the result of this being the site of an ancient river bluff remnant. White, red and black oaks are present. The Chicago Park District restored the understory in 2002 in an attempt to establish plants that once would have grown in such an open oak grove. Bottlebrush grass, woodland sedge and a variety of wildflowers have taken hold. WEST PULLMAN PARK SAVANNA
